

**Floyds Fork Area Study
Stakeholders Meeting, December 10th, 2009
Brief Meeting Summary**

Charles Cash opened the meeting and introduced Brian Bingham and Mark Johnson, of Metropolitan Sewer District.

They discussed the MS4 plan and how it would change the review of development plans in the Floyds Fork area. MSD is currently working on a draft of design guidelines and a summary of the guidelines.

Mr. Bingham and Mr. Johnson discussed current plans for line extensions and improvements to sewer capacity that is going on county-wide. As part of effort to resolve issues of Floyds Fork sewage treatment capacity, sewage that currently goes to Floyds Fork Treatment plant will be re-directed to the Cedar Creek facilities. All of the four centers proposed in the Floyds Fork Area Study will be in the service area that is being re-directed to Cedar Creek.

The overall goal to improve sewage capacity is to have a regional facility near the Salt River. This will entail getting agreements with surrounding counties and ultimately a change in state law.

Discussion/ Q & A session followed.

Charles Cash reviewed the process to come for the Floyds Fork Area Study. He discussed the key changes to be updated in the study document (see attached summary sheet). Mr. Cash stated that consultants, Wallace, Roberts, and Todd (WRT), will be working with staff to make revisions, as discussed, to final draft document. The tentative schedule is to have a final draft document ready in late winter, and to move toward a public hearing on the Floyds Fork Area Study in Spring 2010. Once a final draft plan document is ready, Planning and Design staff will send out electronic copies to the Stakeholder committee members.

Meeting was adjourned.
