It also demands we change the ways we think and interact with each other. This interactive presentation provides opportunities to explore the subtle cues we often miss about each other and to practice some skills that will put us on the road to cultural competence.

Part II

But, what happens when intercultural situations take us by surprise? During this highly interactive session participants will have the opportunity to experience some of the challenges and complexities of the multicultural world we live and work in.
