

**AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009
LOUISVILLE AT WORK TEAM**

**Team Leaders Meeting Summary
May 18, 2009**

- Rick Johnstone called the meeting to order and reported that future meetings will be moved to Conference Room 106 to facilitate discussion. Meetings will continue to be scheduled at 11 a.m. for the present. In light of the Memorial Day holiday, the next regularly scheduled meeting will be held on Monday, June 1st.
- Rick introduced an additional summer intern, Pam Selle, who will be joining the ARRA support team.
- Kim Allen briefly reviewed updates in the ARRA Competitive Grants Status Chart and reported that the companion documents summarizing grant activities for external and associated agencies will be completed this week. In addition to the information being compiled on competitive grants, Rick asked attendees to send in information on formula grants to ensure that the team has a complete and accurate inventory of all ARRA grant activity that can be made available to the public. A one-page template has been provided for this purpose. He reminded Team Leaders regarding submission of concept papers on grant proposals.
- Jane Driskell requested assistance from the support team to ensure that information on all Metro ARRA grant activity is incorporated into the budget process, including operational and capital items.
- Rick Johnstone welcomed Mayor Abramson to the meeting and called for progress reports by each of the ARRA Work Teams.
- Daro Mott reported that the team is developing a LOGIC-based map that will identify locations of stimulus projects. He reported that the Project Trackers are on-line and expressed appreciation for submission of timely information. The Louisville at Work website is being updated and the template will be changing in the coming weeks.
- Rick Johnstone distributed copies of articles outlining a proposal for a “Green Impact Zone” in Kansas City as an example of a city’s attempt to coordinate use of stimulus funding in a targeted area. Although the approach has stirred controversy, members were asked to review the information as a possible model for integrating ARRA funding within designated projects.
