ACADEMY INFORMATION

Citizen's Police Academy sessions are held twice a year and begin in March and September. Sessions are twelve weeks in duration and meet on Tuesday nights from 7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.

Latino Citizen Police Academy is currently offered once a year. This program is offered in Spanish.

International Citizen Police Academy is offered to community leaders with the expectation of them returning to the international citizenship and sharing the knowledge they learned.

Youth Academy is offered two times during the summer. This academy is offered to youths ages 14-17 and is a two week program. The academy focuses on teaching discipline, team building and leadership. The academy is very interactive with an opportunity for youth to test "detective" skills with a mock-crime scene, learn interrogation techniques and solve the "crime". As a structured program, the youth wear uniforms and participate in daily exercise.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing is offered every two years in September. This academy is geared to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community. We have interpreters who help facilitate this program.

Women's Citizens Police Academy is offered every other year in March. It's for women only and we also offer a self-defense class during the academy.

College Citizens Police Academy is geared to college students who are interested in the field of Law Enforcement. Some colleges give credit for taking this academy. Please check with your school.
