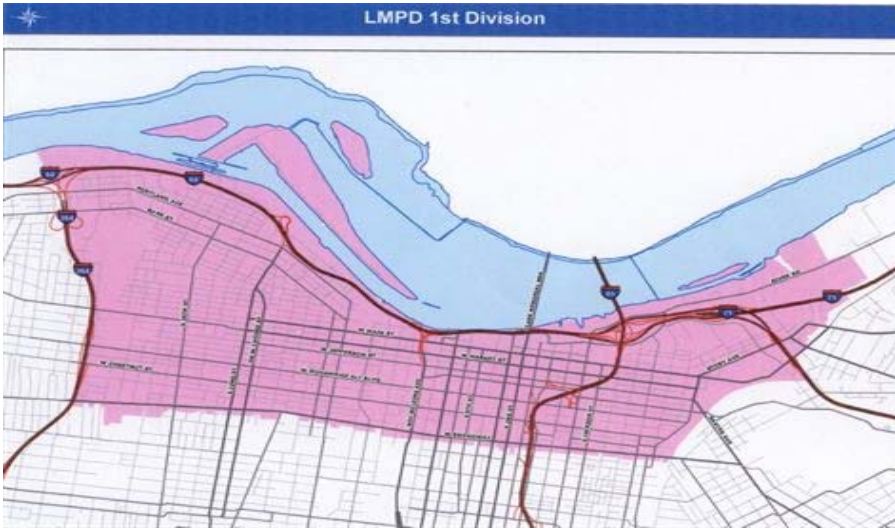

Auto Theft Prevention-Crime Tips

Major Ozzy Gibson, the commander of the First Division, would like to provide you with these Auto Theft Prevention Tips:

- Secure ALL valuables and never leave anything in plain sight. A thief will break into your vehicle just for your loose change. Secure all property such as stereo faceplates, CDs, gym bags, navigation systems, purses, briefcases, sunglasses, cell phones and laptops in your trunk, or take them with you.
- Always park in a well-lit spot at a meter, surface lot or garage.
- Always roll up your windows and lock your doors.
- Have your VIN number etched on all vehicle windows.
- Never leave your car running unattended. It's against the law!
- Never hide a second set of keys in your vehicle.
- Consider engraving items you transport such as golf clubs or a laptop.
- If you have an alarm on your vehicle, use it.

Significant Activity

▪ On June 14, Third Platoon officers received a dispatched run on a strong arm robbery that had just occurred. Dispatch put out a description given by the victim and advised one of the subjects had pointed a gun at the victim. Officer Holland spotted the three subjects at 28th and Cedar Streets. They were taken into custody after the victim identified the subjects. One of the subjects gave a taped statement admitting to the robbery.

▪ On June 16, Officer Jones was dispatched to the area of 2617 West Jefferson Street on a report of an auto-break-in in progress. Upon arrival, Officer Jones observed a subject walking quickly towards Cedar Street with a chainsaw in his hand. As Officer Jones attempted to stop the subject, he dropped the chainsaw and a crow bar and took off running. Officers responded to the area and set up a perimeter. The suspect was found hiding in the rear of a vacant house in the 2700 block of West Jefferson Street. After a brief struggle, he was taken into custody. The subject was taken back to the division and gave a full confession of the theft to Detective Edwards. The subject was arrested and charged with TBUT/0-500 from Auto, Fleeing or Evading, Possession of Burglary Tools and Resisting Arrest.

On June 9 at 8:24 pm, Officer Livers was on routine patrol when he observed a male subject ducking down in between cars on East Witherspoon Street, near Slugger Field. Upon further investigation, officers noticed the subject drop money and a purse while hiding behind a parked car. As officers approached the subject, they noticed a brick lying on the ground and a busted window on the car the subject was hiding behind. The subject was arrested for Theft by Unlawful Taking (TBUT) from Auto. This area had seen a spike in TBUT over Autos in the past week and Officer Livers' diligence while on patrol likely prevented many more thefts.
