**Regulation 1.06
*Stationary Source Monitoring, Recordkeeping
and Reporting Requirements
Version 9/External***

Purpose of the Draft Proposed Action:

The draft amendments to Regulation 1.06 are designed to clarify and streamline the monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting requirements for stationary sources. The proposed amendments delete or combine redundant or outdated provisions, and make other changes to improve readability.

Estimated Costs and Savings:

There are no costs associated with the draft proposed action. Regulated sources are required to maintain emissions information, including emission data and records, pursuant to their District-issued permits.

Feasibility of All Alternatives:

The District determined that removing outdated and redundant provisions will make the substantive requirements of the regulation easier to understand and comply with.

Many of the revisions to Regulation 1.06 Sections 3 and 4 are intended to conform the District's emissions reporting requirements to the current federal reporting requirements for the largest stationary sources, while maintaining the requirement for these sources to report emissions of all toxic air contaminants listed in Regulation 5.23. Other changes, such as those in Section 4 associated with reporting by FEDOOPs, gas stations and other area sources, reflect the maturity of the District's permitting program, under which sources are required to maintain records and periodically report emissions data to the District as conditions of their permits.

Comparison with Any Minimum or Uniform Standards:

The draft proposed action does not reduce any federal reporting requirements for criteria pollutants, HAPs, or ammonia.

Report on Public Outreach Efforts:

This draft proposal to amend Regulation 1.06 is part of a package of proposed amendments to the STAR regulations that was released for informal external review on March 17, 2010, and sent to: all members of the 2009 STAR Advisory Group; all persons who have requested to be informed of proposed changes to STAR regulations; all persons who have requested to be notified of proposed changes to any District regulations; EPA Region 4; and the Kentucky

Division for Air Quality. The District received written comments on this draft proposal and is responding to those in a separate Comment/Response document. The public will have an opportunity to comment at a meeting of the appropriate committee of the Air Pollution Control Board, during the formal public comment period, and at a public hearing prior to consideration by the full Board.
