Green Infrastructure

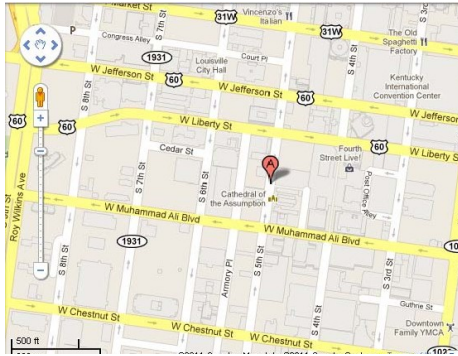
