Sir,

Since starting operations in late February 2006 we have been continuously working to upgrade the onboard radar systems used by our traffic cars to the "Stalker Systems" made by Applied Concepts. Stalker is the same unit that is currently being used by the Department Traffic Unit. Applied Concepts is also the primary contract vendor for radar systems to LMPD.

We were able to allot funds from last year's budget and buy three Stalker systems. An additional Stalker system was obtained from the Transmitter, refurbished, and put into service. This left the remaining five officers using older and less reliable systems and handheld units that were left over from the former JCPD. These units are a variety of different makes and models.

This years budget for the Division unfortunately has less monies available than last years. A directive approved by Major Milburn for the Transmitter to turn over any available Stalker components to the Division has yielded two inoperable counting units and two broken antennas.

I would respectfully request any available monies so we may outfit the remaining traffic officers with up to date radar submitted from your office.

In closing I have listed some of the statistics for the Division and the Traffic Unit.

- **The number one complaint by phone in to the Division or Metro Calls assigned to the Division is speeding.**
- **The Traffic Unit has cleared 465 traffic related Metro calls so far this year.**
- **In less than 7 months since its inception the Divisions Traffic Unit has issued 3900 citations. If 40% of those given a citation paid court costs or went to Traffic School then the Unit has generated over \$200,000 in revenue.**
- **The Unit has made 575 arrests. (95% actually taken into custody)**
- **The Unit has responded to and investigated 1085 accidents.**
- **The Division has had 16 fatal accidents so far this year.**
